Preparing for the Harbor House

In November 2022 Hope for Appalachia purchased a building on the West Side of Charleston. The 9000 sq/ft facility will accomidate the Harbor House residential maternity program, the Children's Resource Center, and HFA offices.

The building has been unoccupied for a number of years, but the space and its proximity to CAMC Women's and Children's make it an ideal building for the Harbor House and the maternity addiction recovery program. Residents will be close to the hospital for checkups during their pregnancy and when they go into labor.

"Having the chance to revitalize a building on the West Side and provide needed programs in that building gives us a chance to both visualy enhance our community and serve those who are deeply hurting and need support" says Annie McVey, Director of Harbor House.

Over the past two months, staff and volunteer teams have been cleaning out the building. Once we have a blank canvas we will begin to plan and build out for the unique needs of each of our ministry programs.

During clean-out we have uncovered beautiful tile flooring and other historical details from when the building was built. Beyond the charm of the older building, there is a need for updates and repairs to make the new HFA facility one that will be able to house our programs and services for many years to come.

Replacing the roof will be the first major project to ensure that all other updates to the facility will be dry and protected.
